**To what extent have you been able to implement your return to work project, or skills learned, to your situation?**

I have initiated the process of reviewing the courses in the mining engineering curriculum to include some topics covered ie, environmental courses, especially those dealing with waste dump design and waste management. The topics have been included in the proposed curriculum.

I initiated training of the same course in Zambia ie *Life of Mine Management of Large Volume Waste*. The training took place in Zambia and attracted participants from the region. The training was fully sponsored by IM4DC.

Following the training, I also initiated the registration of AusAID Award Alumni in Zambia. The Zambia-Australia Award Association (ZAAA) has been formally registered with the Registrar of Companies in Zambia.

Organising and implementing IM4DC training in *Life of Mine Management of Large Volume Waste* in Zambia.

**What have been the challenges involved?**

Sourcing seed funds to start organising short courses in Mining and the Environment, Occupational Health and Safety in Mining, courses on mining policy issues in mining, and others.
