### Western Province Scholarships

The International Scholarship was introduced in 2009.

The scholarship was targeted at school leavers. Successful candidates studied at the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology (RMIT).

The National Scholarship was advertised in 2011.

Scholarship was open to both school leavers & non school leavers to study at tertiary institutions, technical colleges, vocational training & skills training courses at private organisations accredited with the PNG Training Council

# Background on the Scholarships

Papua New Guinea Sustainable Development Program Company (PNGSDP) introduced the scholarship scheme in line with its mandate 'To support & promote sustainable development through projects and initiatives to benefit the people of Papua New Guinea, especially the people of Western Province....' (PNGSDP Annual Report 2012, p2).

## Scholarship Eligibility Criteria

- One or both parents from Western Province
- Evidence of schooling in the province
- Exceptional good academically

# Selection Outcome – 2012 National Scholarship

#### 2012 National Scholarship

- 16 were selected from 972 applicants
- 15 non school leavers & 1 school leaver

#### Distribution by study program

- 1. Post Graduate = 2
- 2. Undergraduate = 6
- 3. Teachers' College = 4
- 4. Private College = 2
- 5. Vocational = 2

2012 TESAS Scholarship

Awarded to school leavers from Western Province.

- 1. Universities = 6
- 2. Teachers' Colleges = 10
- 3. Technical Colleges = 9

# Selection Outcome – 2013 National Scholarship

**Screening Results** 

Distribution of scholarship by Study Program

739 Applications = 426 from school leavers & 313 from non school leavers

University studies = 9

Business Studies = 4

Technical Training = 1

14 were selected from 739 applicants for 2013 scholarship

# Selection Outcome- 2013 International Scholarship

8 students were selected from 99 applicants but 2 were expelled

### Scholarship Management Issues

- High Rejection of applications because of technical, eligibility & academic considerations.
- Limited scholarship but created high expectations
- Age limit Scholarship should focus on investing for the future.
- Gender inequality
- Inequitable distribution of the scholarship

- Uncoordinated scholarship initiatives in the province
- Scholarship selection operated in isolated from the tertiary institutions and the Office of Higher Education
- Scholarship had no link to district development priorities
- PNGSDP & Provincial Government Partnership

- Inadequate guidance assistance was given to students to ensure they were informed and realistic with their choice of study in terms of academic suitability and standard of education at RMIT in Melbourne.
- Inadequate guidance was given to students about the entry requirements of Tertiary institutions in the country.
